- 2. Description of discipline:** The educational and methodological complex of the discipline "General Psychology and Pedagogy" (hereinafter referred to as the EMC) was developed in accordance with the State Standard of Higher Professional Education. The EMC contains the curriculum of the course, materials for lectures and practical classes, methodological recommendations for organizing independent work of students, control tasks for current and final knowledge testing.

The course of general psychology is a basic discipline for students studying in the specialty "General Medicine" (for foreign citizens).

The course is designed for one semester, is taught to students for 4 semesters and is one of the main academic disciplines at the bachelor's level. General psychology, which studies the basic patterns of human and animal behavior, serves as the foundation for all special branches of a fairly diversified modern psychological science. The purpose and objectives of the discipline - the purposes and objectives of studying the discipline are related to the general objectives of the specialty General Medicine (for foreign citizens).

3. The purpose and objectives of the discipline

Tasks of the discipline:

- to form ideas about the methods of scientific research in psychology, ideas about the facts and general laws of development of psyche and consciousness;
- to reveal the content of the mental appearance and individual-psychological features of a person;
- to create in the student a holistic view of man as a developing personality, individuality, subject of life activity;
- to develop the ability to comparatively analyse different approaches to the study of mental and psychological phenomena; to create attitudes to transfer the knowledge obtained in the process of learning into practical psychological and pedagogical activity;
- to promote the awakening, preservation or development of interest in psychology, the desire to work with children, the ability to create favourable conditions for their cognitive development and personal growth, personal attitude to professional activity.

The results of mastering this course assume the students' knowledge of basic psychological categories and concepts, theoretical approaches to the study of man as a subject of activity and cognition, the main experimental ways of solving key problems of general psychology, the laws of formation and development of personality, individual-psychological features of man, emotional-volitional, emotional and cognitive, emotional and psychological features of man, the ability to work with children, the ability to create favourable conditions for their cognitive development and personal growth, personal attitude to professional activity.

The place of discipline in the structure of the BEP (prerequisites, postrequisites) –

This discipline is studied by students of the speciality of Medical Business (for foreign citizens) and is included in the compulsory volume of disciplines studied by the State Standard of Higher Professional Education, etc.

The content of the discipline 'General Psychology' is based on the content of such previous disciplines as 'Normal Anatomy', 'Normal Physiology', 'General Biology'. In the future, the knowledge

obtained during the study of the discipline 'General Psychology' will be necessary in the study of disciplines: 'Pathological Physiology', 'Pathological Anatomy', 'Internal Medicine'.

The given educational and methodical complex is realised on the basis of requirements of the competence-oriented curriculum and is directed on acquisition by students of a number of general cultural and professional competences in that measure, in such perspective and volume which is set by character of problems, theoretical - methodological bases and practical-applied aspects of modern theory and practice of psychological science. The competences, on which this educational-methodical complex of the educational discipline is focused, can be filled also by a complex of knowledge, abilities, skills, provided by other disciplines, realised within the framework of Bachelor's educational programme.
